The exhibition uses home furnishing as the overall concept to raise public awareness of marine plastic pollution through multimedia artworks.

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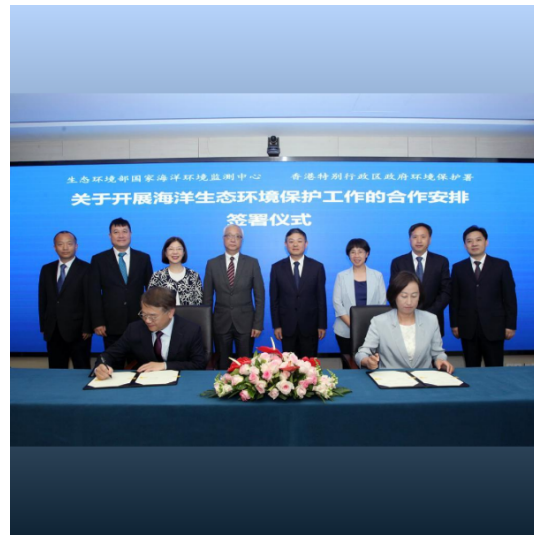

Hong Kong and China are strengthening their co-operation in marine ecological environment protection and water quality management in the Greater Bay Area.

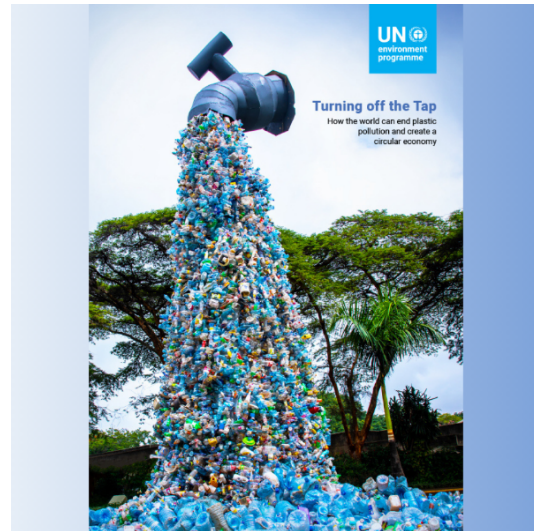
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[Out Now] Sustainable Development Report 2023
